When the national grid fails, creativity thrives. Local startups like Phoenix Power Solutions now repurpose EV batteries for household use. Their tagline? "Your Tesla's retirement plan." Sales jumped 217% post-2022 crisis.

3. Albania's Pumped Hydro 2.0

Why build new dams when old mines can store energy? The Bulgize Project transforms abandoned chromium sites into 80MW pumped hydro facilities. It's like turning your grandpa's pocket watch into a smartwatch.

Real Talk: Why Storage = Survival in This Region

Let's crunch numbers:

Lebanon's diesel generator market: \$1.2B/year (ouch)

Albania's wasted renewable energy: 19% of annual production
